Camelford Leisure Centre – Cllr Ferrett has been co-opted on to the friends of Camelford Leisure Centre and gave brief summary of the ideas being considered to the necessary funds to keep the leisure centre viable.

EA Flood Plan – Cllrs Findlay, Irving-Little and Ferrett have been working with the Environment agency and have drafted a simplified plan. More detail will be available at the next council meeting.

What’s important to the community –

- Walk the Village - Cornwall Council Community Network Manager will be asked to walk the village with councilors and determine what needs doing and who is responsible for it.
- Planning - The Council feels it should have more clout in planning decisions. It was proposed by Cllr Brewer the clerk invite a planning officer to attend a council meeting and provide guidance. Seconded by Cllr Irving Little. All in favour. Resolved.
- Overgrown Shrubs on Council Ground – with uncertainty as to who is responsible a number of councilors volunteered to do some trimming and pruning to the shrubs by the sub-station in Trefleur Close and the path to Tintagel Road from Clover Lane Close, whilst the clerk investigate who is responsible.
- Seating in Harbour area – visitors to the village have suggested there should be more seating in the harbor, following a survey by a student. The clerk to investigate what type of seating the National Trust would be willing to consider in the harbour.
